COVID-19 Safety Plan: City of Barrie – Eastview Arena

- 1. On Game Day of the participating player playing, the player must go to the link: <https://play.barrie.ca> and complete the pre-screening Questions and submit the form. Upon submission of the form, an email is sent to the player's email indicating their approval to enter the facility.**
- 2. The participating player will be allowed in the facility 20 minutes prior to the game. Upon entering the arena, the player must show their proof of FULL Vaccination along valid Forms of I.D. - Birth certificate, Citizenship card, Driver's License, Government Issued Identification Card, Health Card, Status Card or Indigenous membership Card, Permanent Resident Card or Passport. Anyone who has been fully vaccinated and requires their vaccine certificate can print or download their receipt from the provincial booking portal at <https://covid19.ontariohealth.ca>. If a player is partially vaccinated, they will not be allowed to participate until after the 14-day waiting period of their second dose.**
- 3. If a player is medically exempt, they must show a valid document that includes the following:**
 - The name and contact information of the physician or registered nurse (i.e. phone number and address)**
 - A logo or letterhead identifying the physician or registered nurse**
 - A statement that there is a medical reason for the individual's exemption for being fully vaccinated against COVID-19**
 - An effective time-period for the medical reason within the date the individual is seeking access to the arena**
- 4. Every player must follow the Arena protocols as posted by the City of Barrie and communicated via email and the organization website, which includes one (1) dressing room for each team with a maximum of 12 players in each room. No showers will be available and players are to keep masks on at all times until they enter the playing surface. Players are asked to maintain social distance and wash hands frequently. There will be no sharing of water bottles, equipment or any other personal items with any other player or spectator. Each player will not shake hands at the end of the game but glove-on bumps, stick taps will be permitted to show sportsmanship. Each player will not congregate before or after the game in any of the public areas of the arena(s). They will use the designated dressing areas and will exit the facility within 20 minutes of the end of their game.**
- 5. The player rosters contain the rosters of all players (and spares) playing for that particular evening. The statistician will record attendance and forward this to the League convenor for logging and retention each night. The convenor and the township have all contact information for all participants should contact tracing be needed.**
- 6. If a player is feeling unwell prior to their game, they are advised to stay home and advise their captain they are not playing. They will be asked if they have the symptoms of COVID-19 and if so, that player will need to get tested. He will only be allowed to return to league play upon a negative result from their Covid-19 test. If the test is positive, that player will have to quarantine for a period of fourteen (14) days and will not be allowed to play or come to the arena(s).**

- 7. Should there be a player who became ill during a game and exhibits the symptoms of COVID-19, each player and official who may have come into contact with that player will have to get tested. They will only be allowed to return to league play upon a negative result from their Covid-19 test. If the test is positive, the player(s) will have to quarantine for a period of fourteen (14) days and will not be allowed to play or come to the arena(s).**
